PEOPLE Power

WHAT IS AFSCME PEOPLE?

There is no workforce in the state of Washington that has more at stake in decisions made by the Legislature than state employees like us. The state legislature decides our wages, healthcare, pensions, job security, and working conditions.

In Olympia, special interest groups spend millions of dollars every year working with politicians to try and cut our wages and benefits, outsource public services, and take away our freedom to join together to negotiate better conditions. AFSCME PEOPLE is how we fight back. It stands for Public Employees Organized to Promote Legislative Equality. It's our union's Political Action Committee, funded entirely by union members' voluntary contributions.


JOIN AFSCME PEOPLE TODAY!

As individuals we are powerless against moneyed special interests and their agenda. But when we join together through PEOPLE, we have real power that can counter their attacks on our wages and benefits and further improve the lives of public service workers and working families.

PEOPLE is the only way we will adequately fund our political action efforts to make sure special interest-backed politicians can't break us. Political action means registering voters, getting on phones, knocking on doors and building the state's most vibrant member lobbying program. It means rallying, campaigning and making sure that all working families get a fair shot. It means electing candidates who care about public services and the people who provide them. And it means holding the politicians accountable that don't.

HOW DO I BECOME A PEOPLE MVP?

You can become a PEOPLE MVP by giving \$5 a paycheck (and you get a cool union PEOPLE jacket). Just sign a PEOPLE card authorizing your employer to deduct a specific amount of money as your voluntary PEOPLE contribution – money that will be invested in keeping public worker families like yours strong.

Lobby Days Messaging Tips

It is important we send a clear and concise message about the important services we provide to Washingtonians. Talking about the budget, revenue, and our contracts is important; but we also need to connect their issue to the work we do every day. Remind legislators that state services have a real impact on our communities and their constituents.

DO:

- Talk about why you became a state employee – what values drive you to do the work?
- Talk about your values and how they translate to your work.
- Tie those values into a personal story to make it memorable.
- Talk about the improvements the legislature can make – share your vision.
- Speak from the heart.

The reality:

State government is the safety net (the provider of last resort) for all Washington citizens. The cuts necessary to balance the budget would devastate higher education, human services, public safety, and any other part of the budget not protected by constitution or federal mandate.

It is not smart to make cuts that push costs elsewhere or lead to more costs down the road. We need a balanced approach to closing the current budget shortfall that includes closing unfair tax loopholes and identifying new revenue sources to stabilize funding for programs in the short and long term.

DON'T:

- Complain about your agency or management.
- Talk to legislators about waste, fraud and abuse.
- Read a script/letter to your legislator.
- Use acronyms or job titles that don't translate outside your place of work.

The reality:

It is not in our interest to complain about bad management, waste, fraud or abuse to legislators. Our time with legislators is valuable and should be spent talking about things they can take action on or do something about.

Sample message:

"My name is Laura and I'm from the 22nd district here in Olympia. I've been working for the Department of Natural Resources for 15 years. I chose to work in public service because I believe protecting state lands and natural resources is key to having healthy communities all across our state.

As a response coordinator, I dispatch resources to protect state lands from wildfire and other natural disasters/hazards. In the past 5 years, I have seen a lack of competitive pay and the resulting staffing crisis in Washington impact my work and the people I serve. The state's inability to recruit and retain public workers have led to resource and personnel reduction. For example: we used to have 7 responders for a large incident - now we only have 4. It takes those 4 responders nearly twice as long to suppress an incident and ends up costing the state more money and damaging more of our precious resources.

I took time off work today to ask you to fund our 2023-25 contract. With your help we can protect our natural resources for this generation and the next. Can I count on you to fund our 2023-25 contract so we can solve the staffing crisis in Washington and protect our state lands?"



State Employee Contract a Win for WA Communities

Staffing has not kept up with population growth. Fewer public workers are available to provide Washingtonians with the services they depend on.

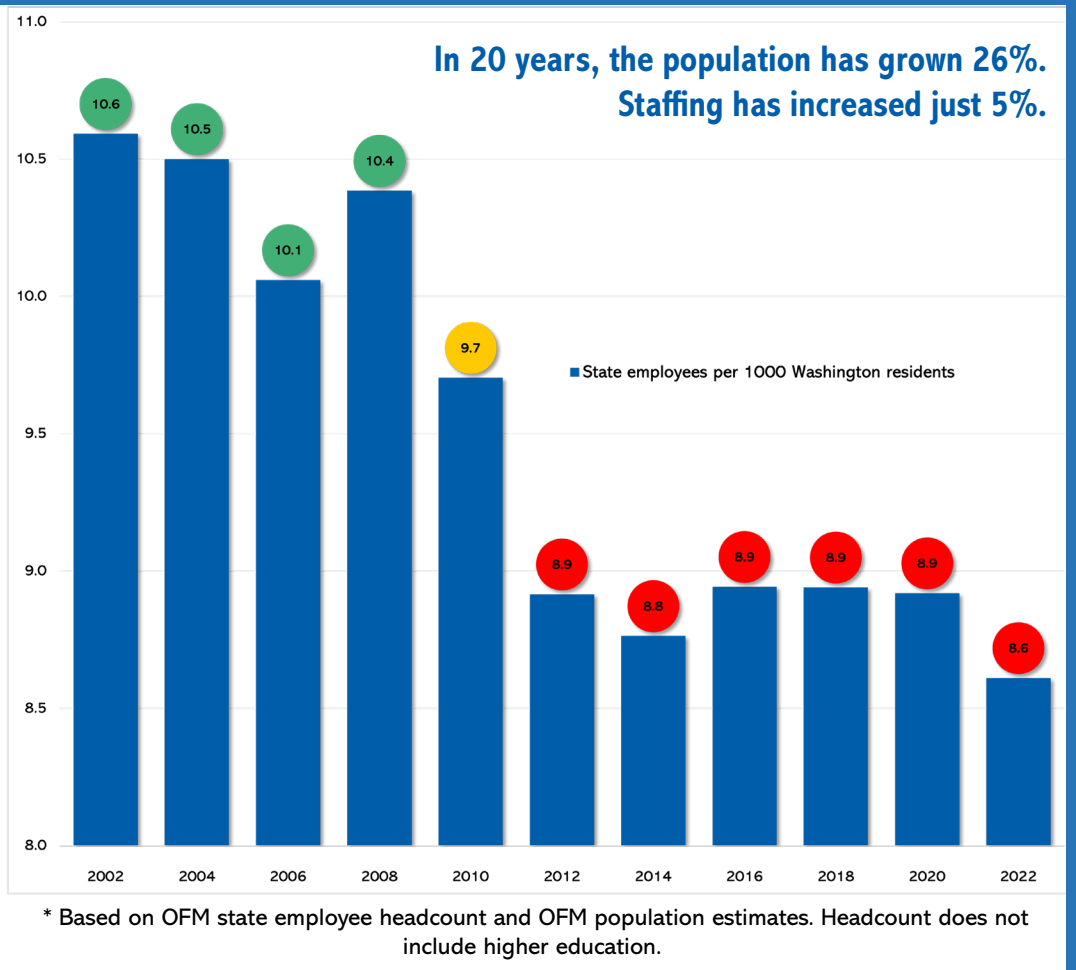
Compensation has also lagged behind, worsening low staffing levels and creating hazardous work environments. Our contract provides common-sense solutions.

Population has continued to grow, but state workforce has not kept up.

In 2002 there were just over 6 million residents with 63,975 general government employees serving them. In 2022, population has ballooned to 7.4 million residents but state employee headcount has stagnated at just 67,721 workers.

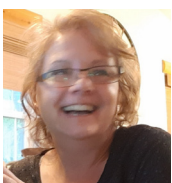
These aren't just numbers. They represent mandatory overtimes and burnout for dedicated public workers and fewer services for the most vulnerable Washingtonians.

The WFSE 2023-25 contract is a good first step in addressing this crisis.

Fixing Washington's Inability to Recruit and Retain the Best

Washington is currently unable to attract and retain the skilled and dedicated public servants that Washingtonians deserve.

The state's own 2022 salary survey found that the state's overall market compensation lags the market by over 16%. This number is the average. The disparity is even greater in many job classifications.

To begin addressing this disparity, our 2023-25 contract includes a \$1,000 retention bonus, a 7% cost of living adjustment and job-class specific raises for 185 positions with documentable recruitment and retention problems.

Additionally, our contract includes a COVID booster incentive payment that will result in the highest number of state employees choosing to receive their boosters, the lowest number of employees choosing to leave state service, and minimal impact to Washingtonians' ability to access critical public services.

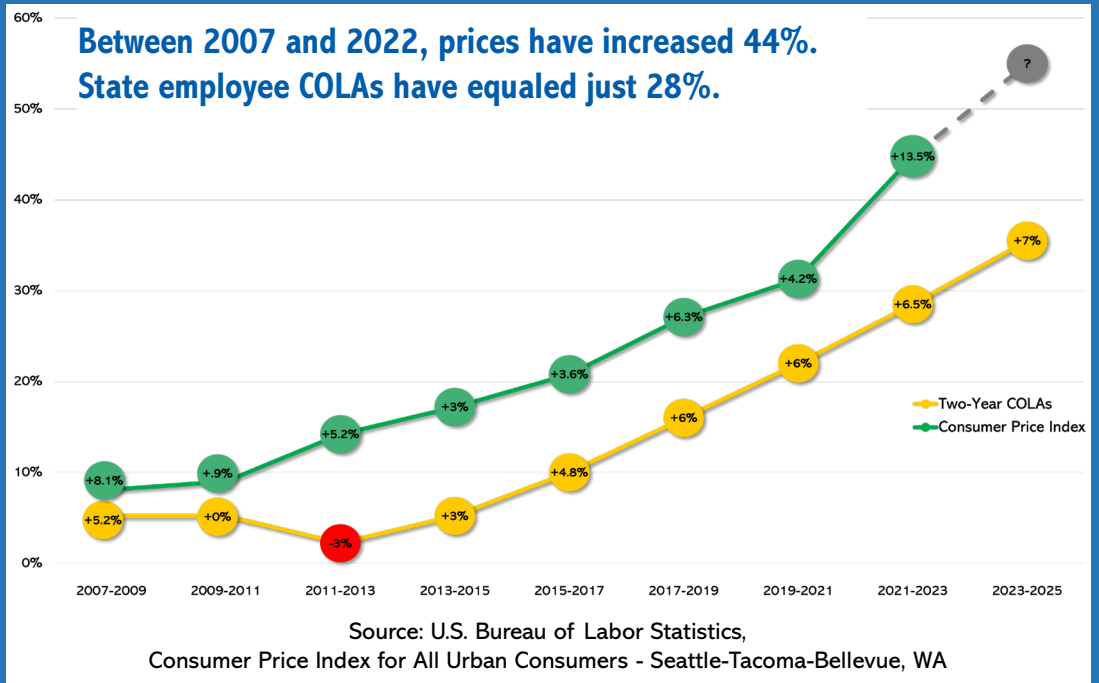
Public Workers Losing Purchasing Power

State employee cost-of-living-adjustment (COLA) raises have not kept up with the cost of living.

Over the last 15 years, state employees have lost 16.3% in purchasing power. Even if inflation is flat between 2023 and 2025, state employees will still be behind by 9.3%.

Our work isn't just about a paycheck; public service is a calling. But many dedicated state employees simply can't afford to work in the public sector in our state.

Let's make sure our workforce can afford to live in the communities they keep running. The 7% COLA in the WFSE 2023-25 contract is a good starting point for workers that are simply trying to catch up.

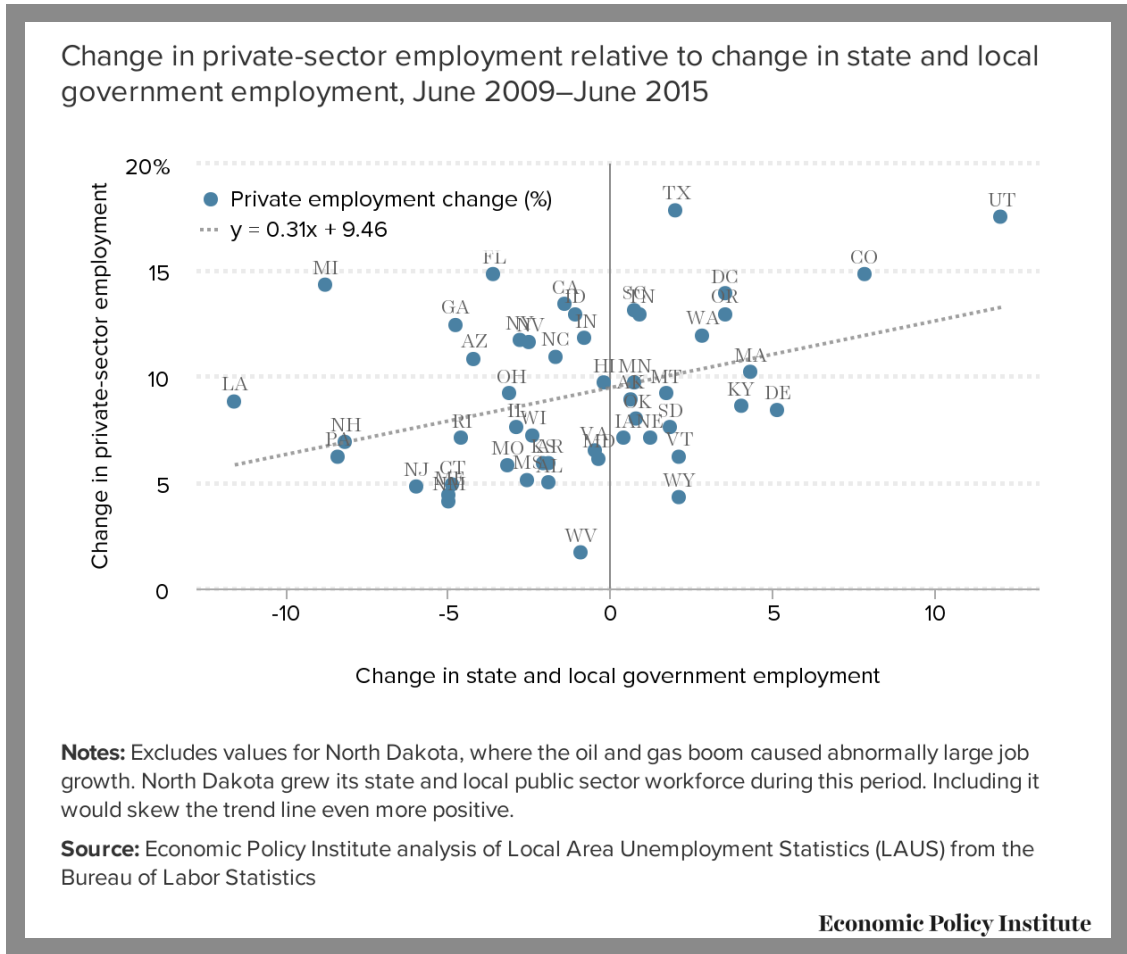


Public Services Make Economies More Resilient

Though our state is projected to bring in about \$681 million more in revenue* than previously anticipated for the coming 2023-2025 budget cycle, some are fearful of a recession.

Regardless of which way the economy heads in Washington, a strong public sector benefits everyone.

During the Great Recession, states that maintained or increased investment in public services fared better (fewer job cuts in public and private sector and faster recovery) than those that implemented cuts.



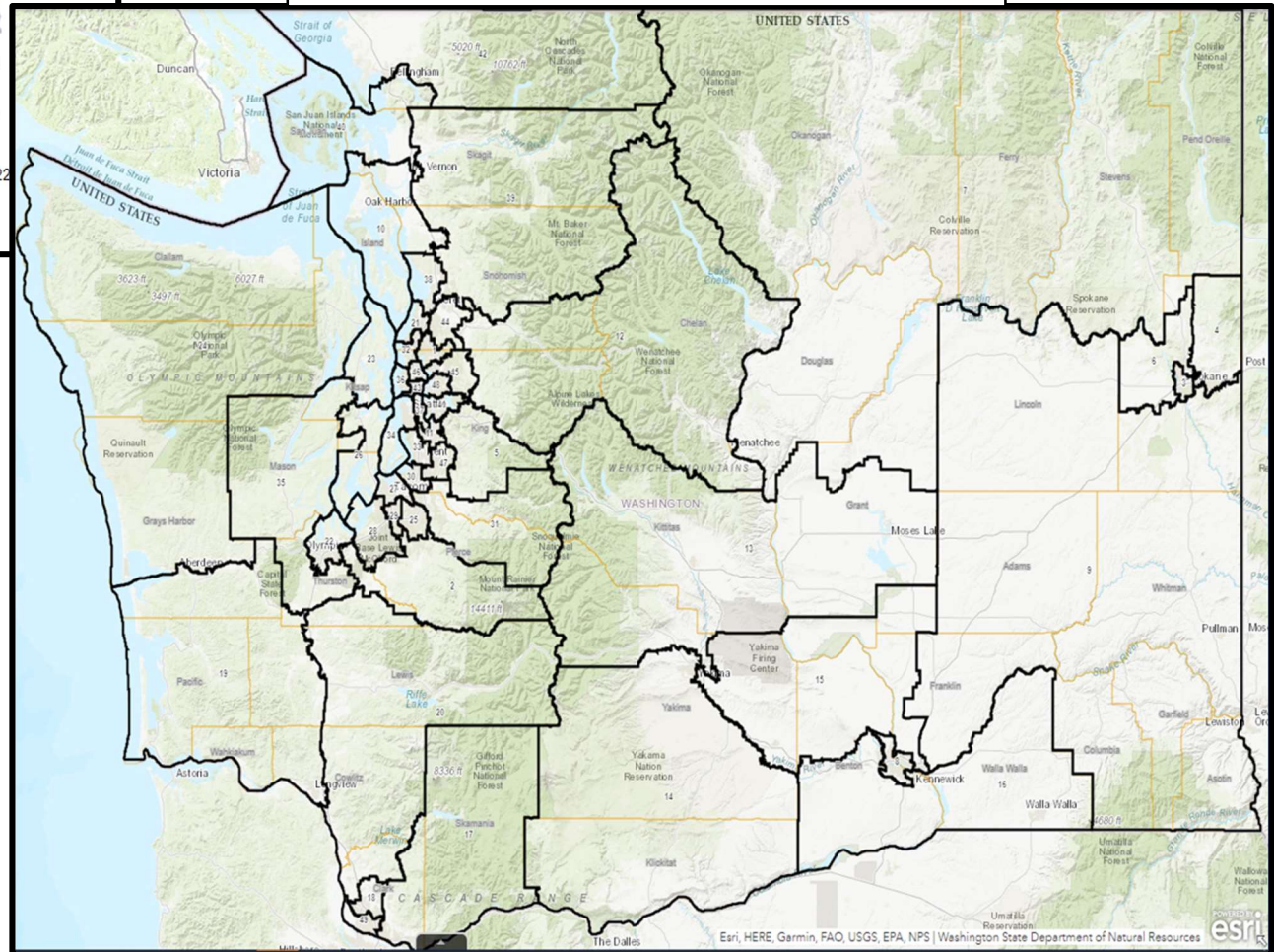

WA Congressional Districts

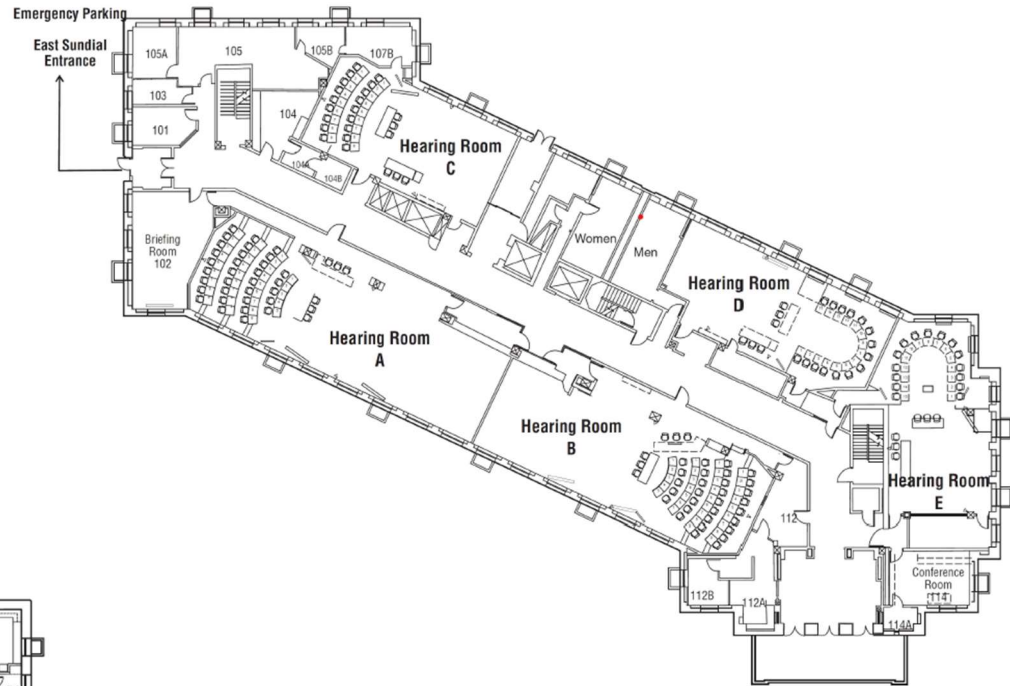

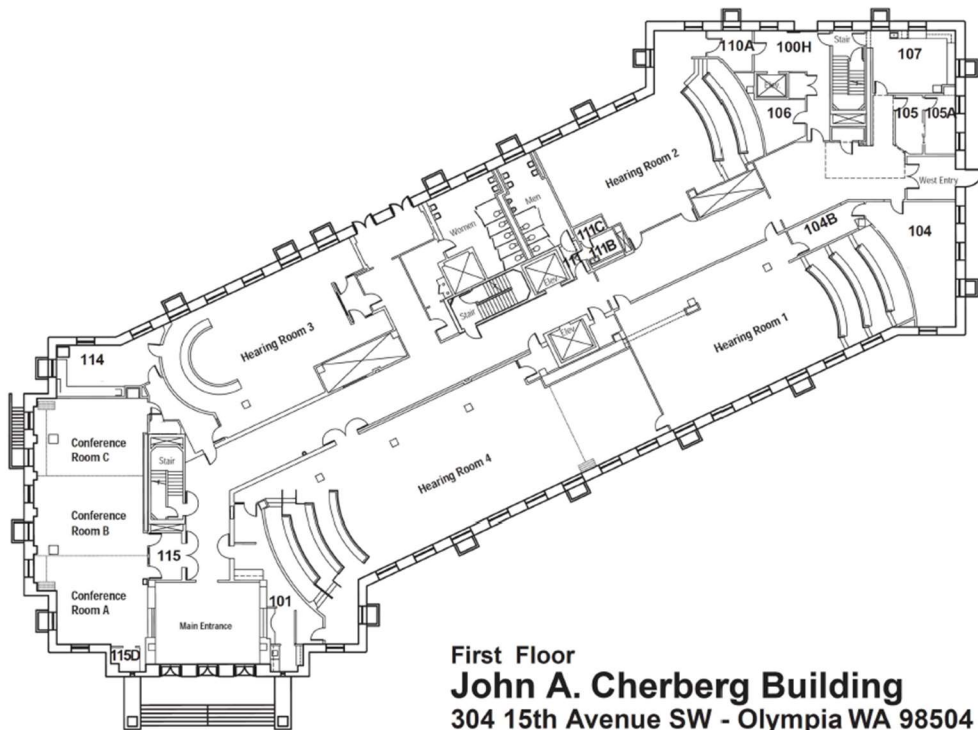

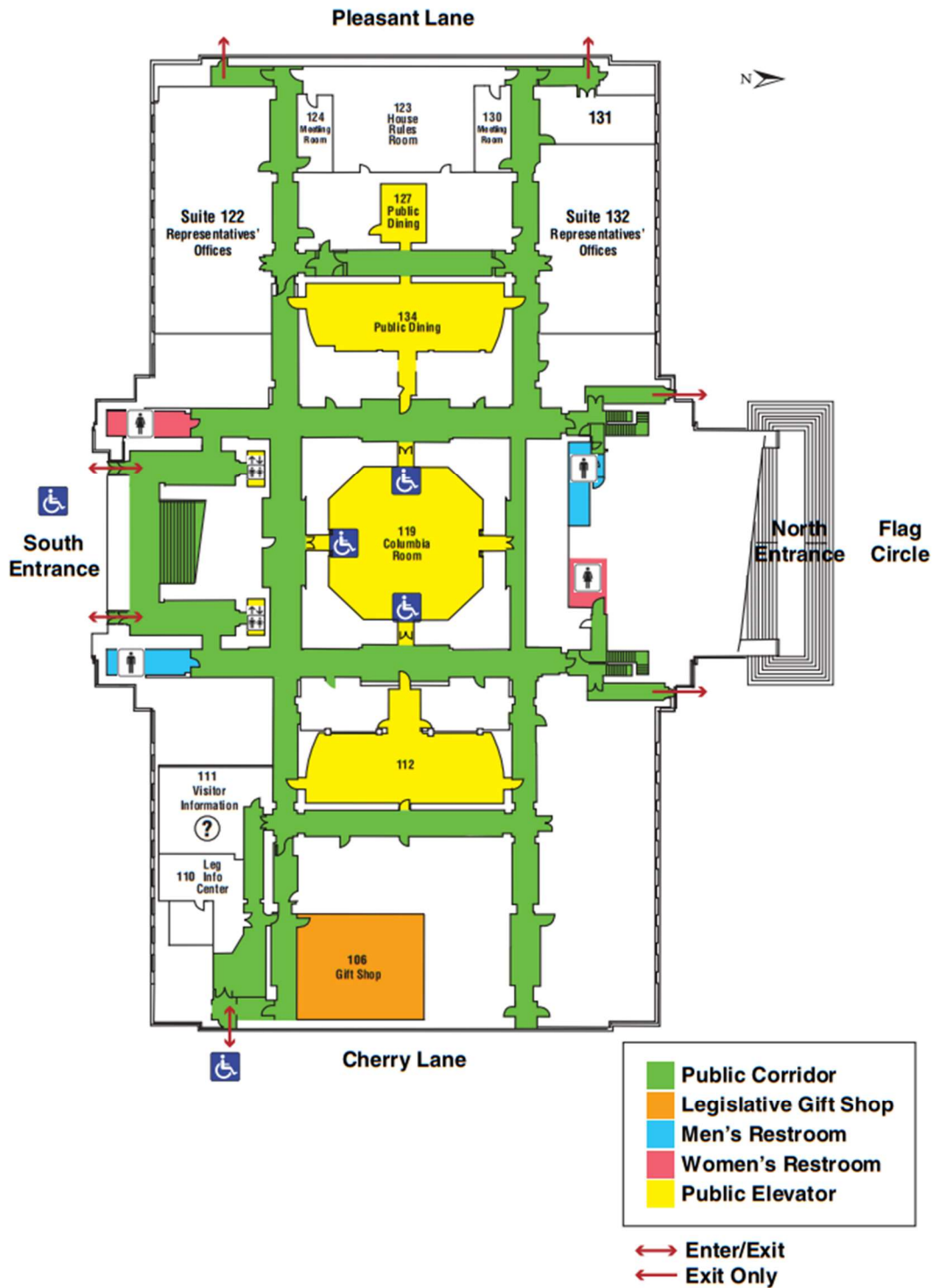
